



### A Letter from the Superintendent, Greg Hughes

Dear Parents,

Life overseas has some tremendous rewards and I know that many of us can recall amazing stories of the sights, sounds and smells that we have experienced while living abroard. There are, however, the challenges that exist in terms of establishing a lifestyle that in many ways is similar to life back "home".

Children, in particular, can find life overseas to be a bit boring at times due to the lack of sports, clubs and other structured programs that exist in the Western world but are not readily available in Khartoum. Here at Khartoum American School we are very cognizant of this fact and now that the month of Ramadan has almost finished we are looking to fill this void and offer an outstanding activity program to all of our students in the coming weeks, which will hopefully inspire, entertain and more importantly give that element of fun that children need at the end of a school day.

Our teachers have made a wonderful commitment to make this activity program one of the best on record and the activity block will now be extended to be a three-day-a-week program, and I am sure students will enjoy many of the new offerings that will be available. Additionally, we will be offering a number of activities for the Middle and High School students that will compliment the many sporting teams that are already on offer.

Small schools such as ours really need to be the focal point of our community and our school goes out of its way to foster this belief. Beyond having excellent sporting opportunities for our students our campus is a buzz most afternoons with people playing basketball, touch rugby, volleyball and soccer as part of our adult sporting programs.
