

A Letter from the Superintendent, Greg Hughes

Sport plays an important part of any school life and I am pleased to report that here at Khartoum American School we have an exceptional sports program and many of our sporting teams are now competing and representing the school with pride. The virtues of sport are countless, including the many character building aspects, but as a school our sporting teams also give us a focal point that we can rally around.

This week our Basketball Teams took to the court for the first time and following on from a fantastic pep rally the whole school was prepared for a strong showing from our Under 19 Boys Team. I am pleased to report that they did not disappoint. The boys played with heart, determination and more importantly, team-spirit. In short, they did us all proud.

For those people who follow the American National Basketball Association or NBA, you would be aware that a few seasons ago the Boston Celtics took the league by storm when they imported three of the strongest players in the league to play on the one squad. In that tradition we had our own three imports, (three new students) Gerald, Ahmed and Hussein, pile on a mammoth 33 of our 38 points, which was too good for Khartoum International Community School, who only managed 20 points. While it was wonderful to see so many of our students turning up to play and also to support, I would like to make special mention of our coaches who I have spotted training at all sorts of irregular hours. So I would like to publicly acknowledge the hard work put in by Coach Parr, Coach M. Abdullah, Coach R. Abdullah, Coach Shannon, Coach Fredericks, and Coach Kelley. The U19 girls will play on Wednesday, September 22nd at 3:30pm.



Hints for Home

It is helpful for a student to have a set place and time for continued study. The place the student works should have adequate lighting and be quiet enough for concentration. Materials (paper, pencils etc.) should be organized and easily available. School papers should be secure from younger siblings and pets. But remember, needs vary. Your child may not wish to be isolated or may rely on some adult support while completing tasks.

When your child participates in determining his/her daily study schedule, he/she is more likely to adhere to it. It should be flexible, allowing for changes due to special events. You may wish to vary it with the seasons to allow for outdoor play in good weather. Consideration might also be given as to whether one lengthy session or two or three shorter sessions are more suitable to your childs work style and attention span. Once studies are complete follow them with something enjoyable of your child's choosing as a reward. It should be agreed that during the planned time there will be no interruptions (telephone, television etc.)

If your child spends an excessive amount of time doing homework, making up classwork or struggling with assignments, consider scheduling a conference with your child's teacher to discuss the matter.


