Students in grades 5-10 have officially begun the Science Fair process for 2011. This year's fair is scheduled for the evening of April 6th. Please encourage discussions about the Science Fair, project possibilities, and experimental methodology over the next couple of weeks at home. Many of our young scientists have already chosen their project topics and are ready to start experimenting. Each student received a Science Fair hand-out designed to guide them through the whole Science Fair process. Science Fairs provide valuable experience for students interested in careers in science related fields, are incubators



for innovation, and a great opportunity for students to showcase their inquiry and problem solving skills. Last year's 2010 Science Fair winners, Andrew Kim and Yousif Makram and runner up Carol Yu Shipei will be on hand to defend their titles; there is already a great deal of buzz and excitement over what they will do this year.

Middle School Exploratories and High School Electives

Our middle and high school students can choose from a variety of electives that promote active learning. Community Service Learning takes students out of the classroom, allowing them opportunities to learn about and serve their communities. Media Literacy students evaluate the media messages that permeate their lives and consider new ways to create them. Students become photographers in Photo Journalism and record and critique images of the world around them. Our middle school 'Exploratories' program allows students to explore new interests and gain skills in classes such as Hispanic Culture, Home Economics, Ping Pong, and Chess.

General Gration's visit to KAS

On Tuesday, February 8, KAS received a visit from Major General Scott Gration, the United States' Special Envoy to Sudan. On behalf of the U.S. government, General Gration has been actively involved in helping Sudan implement the terms of the 2005 Comprehensive Peace Agreement, and has worked closely with major Sudanese leaders throughout the recent referendum process. General Gration spoke with the 11th and 12th grade classes, focusing his comments primarily on his hopes for the future of both North and South Sudan. He responded to several excellent questions from students, and encouraged them to get involved and to be active participants in shaping the future of their countries, whether that be in Sudan or around the world.
