## Symmetry (Grade 2)

Recently, Grade 2 finished a math unit of lines of symmetry. A figure or image has symmetry when it can be folded so two halves match or are identical, the fold line is called the line of symmetry. In Grade 2 we looked at different images and objects around us that had lines of symmetry such as butterflies and shapes. We experimented with different ways of showing the line of symmetry. For example we drew a line of symmetry on coloured paper and then painted on one side of the line, when we folded our painting in half we had an identical image on the other side.

## Chemistry (Grade 11)

This week, the students taught electrochemistry, biochemistry, organic chemistry and nuclear chemistry. They got to put themselves in place of the teacher; and had to deal with the responsibility of the learning of others. As teachers, we are placed in the students' shoes. It was an excellent learning opportunity for the students, as well as for the teacher.


## Field Trip! (Grade l and 4)

On Tuesday Grade 1 and Grade 4 partnered up, hopped on the bus and took a field trip to the Sayga Flour Factory. While there we practiced good hygiene by washing our hands and wearing hair nets. We saw where bread is made, the ovens it is cooked in and where Ozone bakes delicious treats, like cookies! Since everyone knows grade 1 and grade 4 students love pizza we were given a demonstration on how to make pizza. We know that you add the oil at the end, after everything is mixed together, so that the dough is less sticky. We also know that the basic ingredients are flour, water and yeast. Oil, powdered milk and sugar are optional but make for delicious pizza crust. We even got to help knead the dough. After making the dough we got to add ingredients to make pizza. We used ketchup, sweet corn, peppers, mushrooms and mozzarella cheese. They baked the pizzas for us, boxed them up and sent us on our way. When we arrived back at school we got to enjoy our delicious, made by us, pizzas!
