In Grade 4 Discovery, we have been working on an economics unit that involves students in a simulated toy company experience. This unit of inquiry asks essential questions like:

- What resources are needed to develop products?
- How does marketing and opportunity cost effect businesses?
- What are the responsibilities of businesses and workers?

One of the learning activities was to design floor plans of the different departments within our company. First the students drew their design on small graphing paper. Then they enlarged their design and decorated it with recycled materials to represent the capital resources their department would need. We put all of the designs together to create our company and slogan "Toy Mania: Everything is Real."
