This week, as school has just gotten underway, we'd like to encourage you to adopt some supportive habits at home. Below we've highlighted six ideas, but the ideas and resources are endless. - Every student from grades 1 to 12 has received a Day Planner. The student handbook is in the front of this planner/agenda. Teachers and students have taken the time at school to go over the handbook. As parents, please ask to see your child's planner today and take some time to read through the student handbook. Hopefully, some of your conversation with your sons and daughters can revolve around something you read in the handbook. This reinforcement at home will tell your children that you know what is expected at school and that you are working hand in hand with the school for their greatest success.
- At school, students will be expected to write in their planner daily. We encourage you to look it over regularly.
- Students retain significantly more of the information learned at school if they review it once in the evening. Encourage your child to tell you one thing he or she learned in each subject. Better yet, read through class notes from the day with your child.
- Set aside a space which is the homework spot. This should be a place that will not be used for other things and should be equipped with paper, writing utensils, dictionary, etc. but won't be cluttered.
- · Sit down with your children and have them create an evening schedule with you so that they're part of the process of deciding when and where they will do homework each day, what time they will be home, what time they will go to bed, which evenings they will go out, when they will stay in, etc.
- Find something to celebrate everyday!






## News from the ESL program,
