#### <u>One – To-One Laptop Program - Frequently</u> <u>Asked Questions (Part 3)</u>

# What usage restrictions will be in place for student laptop use at school?

During instructional time, students will be directed by their teachers on the appropriate use of their laptop in the classroom. One example would be, teachers will ask students to open their laptops to access digital content and ask students to close their laptops to participate in discussions and non-digital learning activities.

#### How will my student recharge their laptop at school?

All students will be asked to come to school each morning with their laptops charged. There are limited places to recharge in each classroom so one of the expectations is that student laptops are fully charge at the beginning of the school day. To recharge your student's laptop at home you would plug it into the stabilizer you use for your regular home computer.

# Will my student be able to put music and movies on their computer?

Yes, your student will be able to have their favorite school appropriate music and movies on their computers. The MacBook Pro's have a large 500gig hard drive so students will be able to maintain adequate space for school use. Peer to peer, file sharing or torrent software is strictly prohibited on the KAS network. (e.g. Limewire,Bit Torrent, Vuze, etc). They will consume our bandwidth and bring the network to a standstill. Students will
