HOW CAN I ACCESS THIS AMAZING RESOURCE, YOU MAY WONDER?



Message from the Learning Center:

Test Taking

At the Learning Center, we have noticed that tests have been coming up for a lot of middle and high school students this week. Some students have taken advantage of our after school time to prepare for these tests. We're so glad to host you all! Since tests will be part of the whole academic year, we thought we'd share a few tips. We all know that a good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast, including some protein, on the day of a test are vital to optimum performance. We also know that studying for tests is necessary and pays off in the long run with higher grades which open more doors as student apply for colleges.

HOW STUDENTS STUDY FOR TESTS?

Quiet, consistent, clutter and interruption-free workplace is ideal for studying and all homework. Students must begin studying for tests several days in advance of the test day, with extra time the night before. What do we do with that time?

SQ3R is a common study strategy that works!

Survey, glance over the text you must read and remember. Look for highlighted sections, headings, diagrams and pictures with their labels.

Question, ask yourself what you know about each of these. Ask yourself what you want to know, or need to remember about each of these. Write down the key pieces of information you will be looking for as your read the text. Read the text carefully. Think about each sentence as you read it. Ask yourself what is meant by the sentence. If you can't answer your own question, reread the sentence, but this time out loud to yourself. Always be sure you understand what you read before you continue on reading the next sentence or section. When you find an important fact, or an answer to one of the questions you jotted down during the 'Q' step, jot it down in your own words to be sure you understand it.

Recite out loud, what you just wrote down. Reading a fact, then writing it, then reciting it means your brain has interacted with the information three different ways, which means you have a much stronger chance of remembering it. Review, once you've read the entire text, review the notes you made. Read them carefully, making sure you understand what you are reading. Read them more than once. Keep those notes and review them the next days before the test and on test day.

PARENTS, We encourage you to share these strategies even with your younger children, and to encourage your older children to cut out the SQ3R section of this article and hang it in a visible spot near the place they use for study.

Help Your Child Learn Better


There will be an easy to understand presentation on some of the current understandings of the brain and learning. It will provide information for parents on how to better understand and guide children. All ages will be covered.
