# Letter from the Superintendent, Greg Hughes 

Dear Parents,
The school has taken on a very different look this year and the massive changes to the facilities at KAS have definitely enhanced the school and made a dramatic impact upon the lives of our students. Whenever a school embarks upon a makeover such as this, a situation analysis takes place and, in our instance, the prevailing high temperature in Sudan was the overriding factor that was taken into consideration. As such, it would be fair to say that many of our projects have been undertaken to basically "beat the heat".

The most stunning of these is our newly completed Basketball area which has transformed the school in terms of being a hub for students to exercise during and after school. The difference in temperature between the court before it was covered and now is massive, to the point where Basketball is now vying with Soccer as the sport of choice for most students.

Our school made a crucial switch at the end of last year whereby our classrooms moved from using air-coolers to using air-conditioners. This was seen as a big step at the time and this year we are looking to expand on this further. Last week, additional air-conditioners were added to each room and once the new transformer is in place each room will be serviced by two and, sometimes, three units. The wait for our transformer has been agonizingly slow but we are hopeful that this delay has been reduced to a matter of days.

As I am sure that you are aware, the swimming pool project is well underway with phase one, the actual digging of the pool, completed. We will be keeping people posted over the coming weeks as to the progress, and we have a display board in the administration block with plans and pictures that will, hopefully, wet our appetites leading up to the grand opening. We have looked to make this pool as multi-purpose as possible and, as such, everyone has their own perspective as to how they will enjoy it. Some people are obviously looking forward to getting fit and swimming laps, while novice swimmers are looking forward to learn-to-swim classes and I am sure that most of our students are keen to add an extra dimension to their PE lessons. Personally I am looking forward to seeing our families enjoy the pool on the weekends and watching this new facility bring us even closer together as a community.

One big change over the last week was the resurfacing of our Early Childhood playground. Gone is the clay, dirt surface and now the soft, spongy, blue and green tiling allows for happier thrills and spills, while also reducing the dirt factor for all who play there. Our new rubber tiles are also much more pleasing on the eye and from the feedback from our many Nursery and Pre-Schoolers they have been a success all-round.

For years we have all taken great pride in our school, and this pride has grown thanks to all those people who have contributed towards making our campus truly beautiful.
