
It promises to be an amazing evening and we look forward to seeing everyone in attendance.

This coming weekend, KAS will be holding its fifth annual Model United Nations (MUN) conference.

MUN is a program that simulates the decision-making processes of the United Nations by actively involving students in researching major world issues, creating resolutions, and debating policy and possible courses of action. Through MUN, students work collaboratively with students from different grade levels to analyze current world affairs, and in the process strengthen their public speaking and critical thinking skills. This year's conference will focus on three important issues: cyber warfare, independence for Kashmir, and the ongoing war in the DRC.
