Every year we review the way we do things here at KAS in an attempt to continually improve. In recent years we have been communicating with parents and students online using our Moodle web pages. This year, however, we are moving to two new forms of online communication, which we think will both improve the amount of information that we share with parents and allow greater online access throughout our community.

In the Elementary school students have been working with Edmodo, which in essence is an educational version of Facebook. Unlike Facebook it is much safer and more secure, but has many of the fantastic features that Facebook has to offer. Students can submit work online, answer questions, complete surveys and generally interact with the teacher and classmates in a unique online environment. By having our students work with this medium we are exposing them to a vast array of technological skills, which will hopefully prepare them for a bright, technological future.

For families with students in the Middle and High School we are using Engrade, which is very similar to Moodle in that teachers can post work, assignments, and basically offer all of the information that we did previously. However, Engrade offers a much more comprehensive way of posting grades online. It's a program that makes it possible for families to check grades, share the challenge of making sure work is done in a timely and appropriate manner and last, but not least, celebrate student performance and success. Families will have access to information at the click of a mouse with a user friendly system that will help parents track their child's progress and allow them to take a keener interest in their overall schooling.

These two initiatives are examples of how we are moving KAS even further into the technological age, and we are confident that parents will see their children riding this exciting wave of technology for many years to come. Dear Parents and Friends,

Progress reports are going to be sent home today.

Progress reports are generally sent out for students whose work does not meet average expectations. They are usually sent home halfway through the quarter, a few weeks before report cards go out. They are narrative in nature and help explain to students and parents what the issue is as well as provide concrete steps for addressing the issue. Progress reports are intended to help students and parents realize that there is a concern, while at the same time giving students a chance to improve before the main report cards. Progress reports can also be sent for students who are doing exceptionally well in classes.

If your son/daughter gets a progress report you will be asked to sign it and return it to the teacher within three days. Please discuss the progress report card with your child. Read the progress report together and encourage your son/ daughter to talk about their school performance as well as concerns. Please help your child develop a plan of action with goals for improvement. Review your student's work regularly, and check Engrade for assignments, quizzes and tests and pay special attention to grades that go along with them.

You are always welcome to call us if you have any questions or concerns about your student's progress report.

Yes, Elementary is in the swimming pool!


