We have had an exceptional start to the 2012-2013 school year. Every KAS community member has been focused on teaching and learning. Every KAS student has shown improvement. As the first quarter comes to a close teachers are excited about sharing our progress with parents! This means: Parent-Teacher Conferences have arrived! You have already received an invitation for parent-teacher conferences and the teachers at KAS are looking forward to seeing you! If the invitation made it into the school bag, but not into your hands, please let me be the one to invite you to Parent-Teacher Conferences on Wednesday,
October 17th. For Early Childhood and Elementary students, a friendly reminder of your scheduled conference time will be sent home on Tuesday, October 16th, so be on the look out!

Before attending parent-teacher conferences next
Wednesday here are a few suggestions to help you prepare your parent-teacher meeting.

- Introduce yourself to the teacher, and let the teacher know where you can be reached. Email is often the most convenient means of communication for both parents and teachers, so make sure your email is up to date.
- Ask for further information about Edmodo, the new online form of communication in elementary.
- Develop 5 questions specific to your child.
- Make a list of positives and negatives related to your child.
- Say a few words about your child's special interests and positive qualities.
- Ask questions, such as, what is the class going to cover this year, and how can I help? What can we do at home to help?
- Remember to take notes and discuss them with your student.
- Volunteer to help out. Let the teacher and the principal know when you're available. You could help chaperone or organize a field trip, be a guest reader, or be a classroom parent. But don't bite off more than you really have time for. Whatever you decide to do, it is important to be consistent. Be someone the teacher can count on.

It is fun to learn French in Elementary school. After some revision with Grades 3 and 4 we started a new unit, A L'école "in the school". Elementary School Math problem:
Kindergarten: What is the number before two and after two?
Grade 1: What is the value of a penny? What is the value of a nickel? What is the value of a dime? What is the value of a quarter?
Grade 2: There are 20 bricks. Someone brought 4 more. How many are there? Write the number sentence and solve.
Grade 3: Write five number models with 25 as the target number.
Grade 4: Draw an example of concentric, non-concentric and tangent circles.
Grade 5: List the first five prime numbers.

## Middle School Math problem:

What could you be buying if the cost is: 8 for 25 ; 21 for $50 \Phi$; and 347 for 75 ¢ ? It is a logical purchase.

## High School Math problem:

Two fishing boats depart a harbor at the same time, one traveling east, the other south. The eastbound boat travels at a speed $3 \mathrm{mi} / \mathrm{hr}$ fater than the southbound boat. After two hours the boats are 30 mi apart. Find the speed of the southbound boat.

Solutions from the last week:
Kindergarten: 0,2; Grade 1: 100; Grade 2: Answers will vary; Grade 3: $\$ 1.15$, No; Grade 4: Concentric circles don't overlap, have the same centre point and a different radius size. Non-concentric circles overlap/intersect; Grade 5: Answers will vary; Middle School: 14 guppies; High School: The wire used to construct the circle is 190.9 inches long and the perimeter of the square is 169.1 inches long.
