Calling all Juniors and Seniors! It's time to register and take the SAT!

Some of you have already been coming to me with questions about the SAT. So, I thought I would share the information with everyone at KAS. Please continue to be proactive students, and come see me with any questions you have! I am here to help you plan your future after graduating from KAS.

What is the SAT & why is it important?

The SAT is the most widely used college admissions test. It is a tool designed to assess your academic readiness for college and provides a path of opportunities that is fair to all students. For many colleges and universities, it is required that you submit scores for the SAT with your application, but don't wait until you are applying for college to take the SAT. Most college application deadlines are in January of your Senior year, so you want to make sure you are sending the best scores along with your application. That is why it is important to take the SAT early, so that you have time to re-take the test if you didn't score as high as you would have liked.

When should I take the SAT?

The SAT is offered at the KAS testing site 5 times every year. Ideally, you want to take the SAT twice, once during the spring semester of your Junior year (usually in May) and once during the fall of your Senior year (usually October). You can take it more times; however, research has shown that taking the SAT more than twice will not significantly increase your score.

Ok, Ms. Ross, I realize how important it is, what can I do to prepare?

For those of you still studying for the SAT, there are many resources that exist, which include sample test questions and study tips. Get online and check out CollegeBoard www.collegeboard.org for free questions of the day, practice tests, and sample questions, or come to my office to see what I have!

What are the SAT Subject test and should I take one?

Some of you might know exactly what you want to study in college, and one of the best ways to stand out on your application is to take an SAT Subject test that relates to your field of study. For example, if you know that you want to study Chemical Engineering, you might consider taking the Chemistry subject test. Not all schools require these scores, but it just might send a strong signal to admissions committees of your readiness to study in a certain area. Currently, there are 20 subject tests in 5 areas. Not sure which one(s) to take? Check out the CollegeBoard website or come see me for advice.

I have been studying all summer, and I'm ready to take the test. Now what?

Those of you who are ready to take the SAT, it's time to sign up! The next test day is October 5th here at KAS, but you must register online by September 6th in order to take the test. Online registration takes about 20 minutes, and you will need a digital photo and credit card to complete registration.

Also, do yourself a favor and save yourself some time and money...if you would like to send your scores to prospective colleges, please have this information ready during registration. You get four FREE score reports every time you register for the SAT. If you wait to send the scores after you have taken the test, you will have to pay a fee. So, plan ahead and be prepared. Visit www.sat.collegeboard.org to get started and please see me if you have any questions.

The prime time to work on homework is the same day you learned the material. Thinking about an assignment from last chapter will distract you from learning the next chapter. Mentally, this helps you move on to new material each day for class.

Constantly keeping our memory fresh helps us retain new information. When we maintain good study habits, we also continually process and analyze the new information we receive.

more and more smiling faces are appearing in the room.


