

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SAYING OF THE WEEK

The phrase **To Come Up To Scratch** comes from the boxing ring. In early bare-knuckle boxing or prize-fighting bouts, long before the Marquis of Queensberry produced any rules, a line would be scratched in the ground midway between each fighter's corner at the start of the bout. Any boxer who was knocked down would be given 30 seconds to gather his senses and return to the scratch and show he was fit (or willing) enough to continue fighting. Any boxer 'coming up to the scratch' would be allowed to continue, but a boxer not coming up to the scratch was deemed the loser.
