Back To School Night - Wednesday, August 23, 2017 5:00 to 6:30 PM

On Wednesday, August 23rd from 5:00 to 6:30 PM KAS will hold its annual "Back to School Night." We invite all parents to come and learn about the wonderful learning your children will be doing this year. Besides visiting you children's classrooms you will have an opportunity to visit specialist teachers too.

In the elementary classrooms teachers will be giving repeated 15-10 minute presentations so you will be able to visit all the teachers your children have. The Grade 6 Advisory presentation will be given twice. First presentation will be at 6:15 followed by the second presentation at 6:30.

During the evening you will be able to learn how to access these programs by visiting our IT staff in our computer lab if you do not already use these programs.

The security of all children at KAS is the highest priority for us. We are requiring all parents, drivers and nannies to wear identification badges. We also are continuing our policy that all cars must have a KAS vehicle sticker located in the corner of the windshield. Security guards will not allow vehicles dropping off or picking up students on campus without one.

If you do not have a personal ID badge or your driver and nanny do not have one, then please stop by the office to let us know so we can make one for you. Starting on Sunday, October 1, no adult will be allowed on campus without wearing an ID badge.

At the first parent seminar evening (date to be announced) I will be giving a presentation and discussing safeguarding our children with parents.
